Empowering communities in Bangladesh to reduce harm and create lasting, systemic change



The ARC initiative worked with six organisations in Bangladesh: Alokito Kori, Arshirbad Mohila Unnayan Samity, BRED, DHARA, ECDO, and Grow Your Reader Foundation.

The Global Fund for Children supports locally-led organisations around the world to advance the rights of children and youth through flexible funding and capacity building. Its Addressing Root Causes (ARC) initiative empowers communities in Bangladesh to tackle the underlying causes of child harm and exploitation—such as poverty, inequality, and lack of opportunity—through community-led, youth-driven, and preventative approaches.

Using the Community Life Competence Process (CLCP) and the SALT framework (Support, Appreciate, Listen, and Transfer), ARC fosters trust, reflection, and community-driven solutions. The initiative empowers youth

and communities to lead local interventions, reduce harm, and promote child rights, while inspiring confidence in their ability to drive meaningful change.
